The Henderson Brass Quintet has performed on more than thirty programs throughout the state of Arkansas and in Texas since the ensemble was first formed two years ago.

Robert Levy, Instructor of Music, is director of the brass ensemble program at Henderson and a member of the Arkansas Orchestra Society in Little Rock. A graduate of Ithaca College and North Texas State University, he has performed numerous solo and chamber music recitals since coming to Henderson.

Randy Keen is a junior music major from North Little Rock. He has studied trumpet privately for six of the seven years he has been playing. At Henderson, Randy is a member of Phi Mu Alpha, symphonic band, Henderson Collegians and has participated in the Arkansas Intercollegiate Band.
