GUEST CONDUCTOR

Dr. Martin Mailman is Professor of Music and Coordinator of Composition at North Texas State University. His composition "Exaltations" was written for wind band and selected by the American Bandmasters Association to receive the 1983 NABIM Award. He is an annual recipient of the ASCAP Award and in 1982 he won the prestigious Queen Marie-Jose Prize for Composition for his "Concerto for Violin and Orchestra."

GUEST SOLOIST

Mr. Donald Kramer, a native of Joliet, Illinois, received his early band training under the direction of Forrest L. McAllister and Charles S. Peters in the Joliet Grade School Band. A graduate of Oklahoma City University and the University of Illinois, with additional graduate study at The University of Southern Mississippi, Mr. Kramer was Assistant Director of Bands at The University of Oklahoma, and Director of Bands at The University of Arkansas at Little Rock before coming to Henderson in 1972 as Associate Professor of Music. He will be featured on the piccolo trumpet playing Tartini's Concerto in D.
