Finally, we have asked alumni and friends to contribute the mount of money equal to their graduating year to the Annual Fund. That has been very 'cessful due to Reddies affiliation with their class and classmates.

## Alum Establishes Band Scholarship for \$25,000

Texarkana musician Dennis Vaughan, a 1963 music major graduate of Henderson, has established the largest band scholarship endowment in Henderson's history. He recently presented Dr. John G. Hall, treasurer of the Henderson Foundation, with a contribution of \$25,000 to endow the Dennis Vaughan Band (Trumpet) Scholarship which will provide \$1,200 annually to a graduate of Arkansas High, Texas High, or Pleasant Grove (TX) high schools to attend Henderson State University to study trumpet in the Department of Music.

The scholarship will be awarded annually in honor of long-time Henderson band director and Vaughan's close friend, Wendell O. Evanson. Vaughan, who was an outstanding trumpet player in various instrumental groups at Henderson when Evanson was director, was a member of the first Henderson Jazz Band USO International Tour.

In addition to earning his BME degree from Henderson, Vaughan also holds a Master of Music degree from the University of Mississippi and has done additional graduate work at the University of Southern Mississippi. He has served as vand director in schools in Arkansas, Mississippi, Tennessee, and Texas.

"Mr. Vaughan's family has been associated with Henderson since its Methodist years," said Hall. "His scholarship will assist the Henderson Band in its journey to national prominence. He clearly understands our need to help talented students develop their skills to the fullest."



## **Smith Garner House to Hold Foundation**

Mrs. Erwin Garner, former Professor of Home Economics (Family and Consumer Sciences) at Henderson and widow of the late Erwin W. Garner, long-time Vice President for Financial Affairs at Henderson, has given her house located at 324 North 12<sup>th</sup> Street to the Henderson State University Foundation.

The Foundation Board room and offices for Dr. John Hall, Treasurer, and Mrs. Tanya Dixon, Financial Officer, of the Foundation are located there. H. Grady Smith, former Business Manager and Trustee of Henderson built the English cottage-style house in 1932. The house

was the residence of Mr. Smith, and his wife, Lois McNabb Smith, Professor and Chair of the Music Department at Henderson until their deaths in the 1980s. Erwin Garner acquired the house following Mr. Smith's death. The Garner's made extensive improvements to the property. Mr. Garner died in 1995 and his wife, Rebecca deeded the house to the Henderson Foundation in September 1999.

The Foundation will make the house, with its high ceilings and hardwood floors, available to the Henderson Alumni Association for alumni board meetings and receptions. Some of

the Alumni Association furniture from the former alumni house on Henderson Street will be placed in the Smith-Garner House.

All alumni and friends are encouraged to visit the new headquarters of the Henderson Foundation. The Foundation is the 501(c)3 tax-exempt corporation for Henderson, was formerly housed in the historic Barkman House.
