#### **PROGRAM**

Toccata in DMajor......Giambattista Martini (1706-1784)

Padre Martini, a Franciscan monk, was almost singlehandedly responsible for the reputation which Bologna, Italy developed as an international center for instrumental music in the 18th century. As director of music at the basilica of Saint Francis, he was an accomplished organist, violinist, harpsichordist, singer, and composer. He was also an erudite music historian, theorist, and teacher of such notable pupils as Johann Christian Bach and Wolfgang Mozart.

In 1939, Copland was commissioned to write incidental music for a new play by Irwin Shaw called Quiet City. The drama was a realistic fantasy concerning the night-thoughts of many different kinds of people in a great city, and called for music evocative of the nostalgia and inner stress of a society profoundly aware of its own insecurity. The trumpet was used to arouse the conscience of his fellow players and of the audience. In 1940, Copland made use of the thematic material of the play's music for an orchestral tone poem. The work was originally scored for trumpet, English horn, and strings.

The Hollow Men.....Vincent Persichetti
(1915-1987)

In his poem, The Hollow Men, T. S. Eliot presented a meditation, in five parts, on the subject of human nature in this world, and on the relationship of this world to the kingdoms of Death and Eternity. In the Post-War existentialism of the twenties, Eliot searched for his own spiritual fulfillment. His "hollow men" become figures lost in confused society, or defeated by it - people who drift through life without ever taking action to make themselves significant. Eliot's absorption with Dantes' <u>Divine Comedy</u> is evident in the parallels to Dante's various types of soul after death, the most significant being those who are neither in Paradise nor Purgatory nor Hell, but remain in a Limbo outside of Hell - a nothingness reflecting their vacuity, their pointless drifting through life. Section II presents a personal lament for lost Paradise and beauty. In Section IV, the speaker wallows in total despair. The place is as hollow as the men. Section V is an incantation, a confession, with hope growing fainter. There is no conclusion.

Monteverdi's theme is from the Prologue of his 1607 opera <u>L'Orfeo</u> where it is played by five natural trumpets. Gardner weaves the theme throughout all four movements in the traditional format of the "church" sonata of the Baroque period. Notable also are the antiphonal echoes of the two horns, reminiscent of the spatial music of Gabrieli and the grand choir tradition at St. Mark's Cathedral in Venice.

This work was written for trumpeters John Wilbraham and Michael Laird and organist John Birch and was premiered in England's Chichester Cathedral in 1976. It should be noted that Wilbraham and Laird both worked with Philip Jones who established the Philip Jones Brass Ensemble of five to fifteen players in the fifties. This ensemble, along with the New York Brass Quintet, pioneered the modern brass ensemble tradition.
