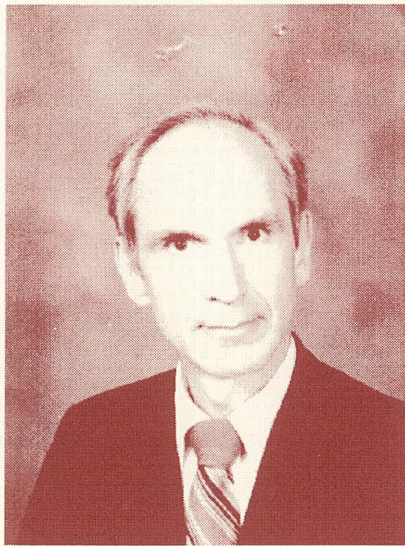

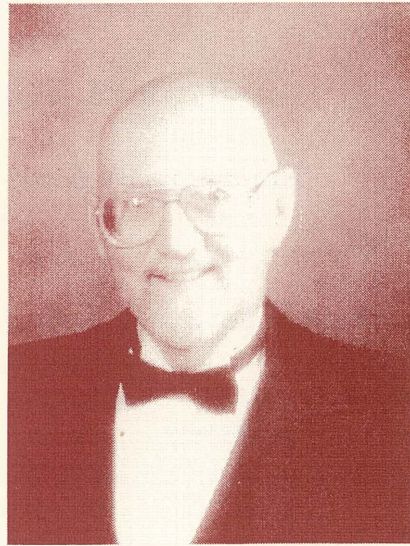

MR. TOM CHASE

Associate professor of music, Tom Chase was first appointed a member of the Henderson State University faculty in 1966. A native of Hornell, New York, he graduated from Hornell High School and earned a bachelor of music degree from the Eastman School of Music in 1954. Chase went on to Boston University (Massachusetts) to earn a masters degree in music in 1958. Since that time, he has done advanced degree work at Indiana University, Bloomington.

Prior to his appointment at Henderson, Chase was a piano teacher at Sacred Heart Academy, Rochester, New York, and an assistant professor of music at Stratford College, Danville, Virginia. A member of Pi Kappa Lambda Honorary Music Fraternity in college, he holds professional membership in the Music Teachers National Association.

Chase served as Interim Chair of the Music Department during the 1989-1990 school year. He has also been Faculty Advisor and Province Governor for the Phi Mu Alpha Fraternity. Chase has served on the Board of Director's and been the coordinator for the Piano Rally for the Arkansas State Music Teachers Association.

While at Henderson State, Chase has accompanied students from every area within the department for student recitals, juries, junior/senior recitals and faculty recitals.

DR. EARL J. HESSE

Dr. Earl J. Hesse is presently a Professor of Music at Henderson State University. Hesse holds bachelor's and master's degrees in music education from Hardin-Simmons University, and earned his doctorate from the University of Mississippi, Oxford. He has taught applied woodwinds at Henderson State University for the past twenty-three years, and was director of the Collegiate Jazz Band for fifteen years. Prior to Henderson, Hesse was band director at Crowell High School, Crowell, Texas; Cisco Junior College, Cisco, Texas; and Goddard High School, Roswell, New Mexico.

Hesse was a member of the Arkansas Symphony Orchestra for fourteen years, and is a past member of symphonies in Abilene, Texas; Fort Worth, Texas; and Roswell, New Mexico. He presently performs with the symphonies in Pine Bluff, Arkansas; El Dorado, Arkansas, and Tupelo, Mississippi.

Hesse holds professional memberships in the American School Band Directors Association; Phi Beta Mu, American Bandmasters Fraternity; Phi Mu Alpha, Music Fraternity; Kappa Kappa Psi, band fraternity; Outstanding Educators of America, Who's Who in American Education; National Clarinet Society and the American Saxophone Congress.

He is married to Kathryn Cotten Hesse, and they have four married children. Robert Hesse, Director of Bands at Arkadelphia High School, Arkadelphia, Arkansas; Valaree Hesse, Occupational Therapist with the Baptist System, Arkadelphia, Arkansas; Marc Hesse and Michael Hesse, attorneys in Dallas, Texas.

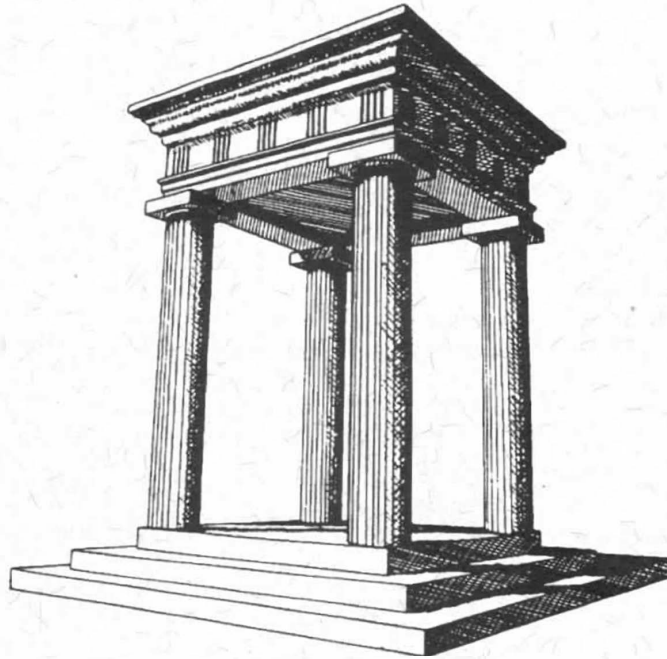
