

Requiem, Op. 9 (1947) Maurice Duruflé

I. Introit

Rest eternal grant to them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. A hymn befits Thee, O God, in Zion; and to Thee a vow shall be fulfilled in Jerusalem. Hear my prayer, for unto thee all flesh shall come. Rest eternal grant to them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them.

II. Kyrie

Lord have mercy, Christ have mercy, Lord have mercy.

III. Domine Jesu Christe

Lord Jesus Christ, King of Glory, liberate the souls of all the faithful departed, from the pains of hell and from the deep pit;

Deliver them from the lion's mouth; let not hell swallow them up, let them not fall into darkness:

But let Michael, the holy standard-bearer, bring them into the holy light, which was promised to Abraham and to his seed.

Sacrifices and prayers of praise, O Lord, we offer to Thee. Receive them, Lord, on behalf of those souls we commemorate this day.

Grant them, O Lord, to pass from death unto life, which once was promised to Abraham and to his seed.

IV. Sanctus

Holy, Holy, Lord God of Hosts. Heaven and earth are full of Thy glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is He who comes in the name of The Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

V. Pie Jesu

Merciful Lord Jesus, grant them rest.

VI. Agnus Dei

Lamb of God, who takest away the sins of the world, grant them rest everlasting.

VII. Lux aeterna

VIII. Libera me

Deliver me, O Lord, from death eternal, on that dreadful day: When the heavens and earth shall quake, when Thou shalt come to judge the world by fire. I am seized by trembling, and I fear until the judgement shall come, and I also dread the coming wrath: When the heavens and earth shall quake.

VIII. Libera me (cont.)

O that day, day of wrath, day of calamity and misery, momentous day, and exceedingly bitter, when Thou shalt come to judge the world by fire. Eternal rest grant to them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. Deliver me, O Lord, from death eternal, on that dreadful day: When the heavens and the earth shall quake, when Thou shalt come to judge the world by fire. Deliver me, O Lord, from death eternal.

IX. In paradisum

May the angels lead you into paradise; May the Martyrs welcome you upon your arrival, and lead you into the Holy City of Jerusalem.

May a choir of Angels welcome you, and, with poor Lazarus of old, may you have eternal rest.

The Work

The *Requiem*, *Op.9*, was commissioned by Duruflé's publisher, Durand and Company, and is dedicated to the composer's father. It was completed in September, 1947, and received its first performance two months later. At the time of the commission, Duruflé was working on a suite for organ solo based on the Gregorian chants of the Mass for the Dead. This was expanded and transformed to become the *Requiem*, *Op.9*. Hence, it is natural that many of the *Requiem's* melodies are directly based on these ancient plainsongs and their associated modal scales. They appear throughout, complete or fragmentary, in vocal parts and accompaniments, at the original pitch or transposed.

Maurice Duruflé

Born in Louviers, a pupil at the choir school of the Cathedral of Rouen, Duruflé went to Paris to study organ with Tournemire and Vierne, for whom he substituted at Sainte-Clotilde and Notre Dame. At the Conservatoire, he received first prize in organ and improvisation, harmony, fugue, piano accompaniment, and composition, in the classes of J. Gallon, Caussade, Estyle and Dukas.

In 1930 Duruflé was appointed organist at the church of St. Etienne-du-Mont in Paris, a position with which he remained associated until his death in 1986. He taught at the Paris Conservatoire from 1943 until 1969, served briefly as organist with its famous orchestra, and was soloist in the premiere performance and recording of the Poulenc Organ Concerto.

Among the compositions of Duruflé are the "Prelude, Adagio and Choral Variations on *Veni Creator*" and "Scherzo, Suite, Prelude and Fugue on the Name of Alain" for Organ. Other works are the "Prelude, Recitative and Variations for Flute, Viola and Piano;" four motets for *a cappella* chorus; "Three Dances, Andante and Scherzo" for orchestra; and the *Requiem*.
