Biography

Dr. Jim Buckner was Professor of Music at Henderson State University from 1990 to 2022, teaching trumpet and high brass methods and conducting brass ensembles. He served as chair of the HSU Music Department for nine years and received the Faculty Excellence Award in Teaching in 2001. Buckner previously taught at Illinois State University, Quincy University, Western Carolina University, and Truman State University and was assistant band director at Waterloo (Iowa) West High School.

In 2020, Buckner wrote High Brass Methods: A Guide to Teaching Trumpet and Horn. He served as Contest Controller for the North American Brass Band Association from 2007-2015, as president of the Arkansas Association of Schools of Music, and as personnel manager for Mass Brass & Percussion.

Buckner has been the principal trumpeter with the Arkansas Brass and the South Arkansas Symphony Orchestra since 1990 and played first trumpet with the Arkansas Symphony Orchestra. He played for the national touring productions of Titanic and Peter Pan with Cathy Rigby and performed five times as a guest soloist with The Dallas Brass.

In September 1995, Buckner performed at the Moscow International Trumpet Festival. As a member of the Mississippi River Brass Band, he was named Outstanding Soloist, Championship Division, at the Fifth Annual North American Brass Band Championships. While a member of the Smoky Mountain Brass Band, Buckner performed at the 1982 World's Fair; he was a guest artist at the 1980 Trumpet Conference in St. Louis, Missouri.

Buckner has soloed with several orchestras, including the South Arkansas Symphony Orchestra, the Illinois Wesleyan University Chamber Orchestra, the Quincy Symphony Orchestra, and three times on the Bach Brandenburg Concerto No. 2 (Quincy Symphony Orchestra, Brevard Chamber Orchestra, and Truman State Festival Orchestra). He has been a featured soloist with school, college, and community bands throughout the South and Midwest.

He has performed with many jazz ensembles, including the Arkansas All-Star Big Band, the Harry James Orchestra, and the Glenn Miller Orchestra. Under his guidance, the Henderson State University Trumpet Guild brought many guest artists to HSU, including Doc Severinsen, Allen Vizzutti, Wayne Bergeron, Rex Richardson, and Andrea Giuffredi.

Buckner received the Bachelor of Music in Instrumental Music Education from Iowa State University, the Master of Music in Trumpet Performance from the University of Michigan, and the Doctor of Music in Trumpet Performance from Northwestern University.
